This heritage represents the centre of villages, a social life, a cultural space, a place of prayer or peace, a tourist attraction, etc.



- To showcase our religious heritage and make it accessible to the local and foreign visitors.
- To create tools that will help visitors to discover and interpret it.
- Disseminate and promote activities to bring religious heritage to life, such as visits, concerts, conferences, activities, etc.
- Establish links between local teams and the network, breaking the isolation administrators.





In practical terms, this project involves a number of actions:

Creation of a network of "open and welcoming" churches

- An "Open Churches" map published annually and distributed to all the regions in the network
- A website in 4 languages with a geolocation system listing places to visit, a diary of events, routes to take, etc.

Publication of brochures distributed in tourist offices and churches along the route.










